### News in Brief ...

#### **Weis Markets opens** beer-wine café

#### **Fairview Township** supervisors hear complaint about cats

Fairview Township supervisors heard a complaint at their June meeting from Forest Road resident Mike Daikon who told them he has a problem with feral cats on his property.

Daikon told supervisors that a neighbor is feeding cats which are defecating on his property, in his shrub bed, and making a mess of his grass. He asked the supervisors if they could pass an ordinance to make it illegal to feed stray or feral cats. Following a discussion, supervisor Michael Iorio made a motion to amend the township code or ordinances. The motion to amend the ordinance was approved unanimously. Before the change becomes law, the amendment must be advertised and voted

on at the supervisors July 2 meeting.

#### In other business ...

Supervisors voted to reject the lone bid of \$84,498 received for construction of an approximately one-quarter mile walking path at Memorial Park. Supervisors said the bid was over budget. They plan to re-bid the project in early winter 2020. The township received a grant from the state Department of Community and Natural Resources to build the walkway.

Bids for the Gracedale Avenue road project were tabled as the lowest was nearly \$40,000 more than a grant received for the project. The township received a \$58,000 state grant for the work. The scope of the project was changed, and it was re-bid in June after original bids also came in over budget. The township is going to contact the state Department of Community and Natural Resources to determine if the deadline to spend the grant funds can be extended.

Supervisors did award a contract to Bob LaSota Construction to replace the roof on the municipal building at a cost of \$12,775.

Supervisors accepted the resignation of police officer Shawn McCole and hired David O'Brien as a full-time officer.

Zoning officer John Doddo told supervisors he is being inundated with complaints about high grass and dead trees. He reported he has been sending out courtesy letters notifying the owners of these violations and give them 30 days to address the problems. If they are not corrected, he said the township will cut the grass and remove the dead trees and put a lien on the properties.

Supervisor Fred Rose reported the township's annual summer park program got underway on June 17 with approximately 20 children participating. Rachell Pickett was appointed park program director at \$10 per hour. Other staff appointed were: Coit Holbrook, assistant park director at \$9 per hour; park aides Taylor Tomalinas and Cassidy Brumagin, \$7.50 per hour; Andrew Lehman, Nathan Dunsmuir, and Courtney Stone at \$7.75 per hour; and Alexandria Briggs-Reichart at \$9 per hour.






