Since the start of the Covid-19 pandemic, Crestwood School District food service has served 44,356 meals to the students and children of the Crestwood School District and surrounding communities in the Greater Mountain Top area. That's 22,178 breakfast meals and 22,178 lunch meals since March 16. The Grab & Go meal program ended on Wednesday, June 10. They will be closed

Friday, June 12 for graduation preparations and celebrations.

Starting Monday, June 15, Crestwood School District will be offering a new summer meals program. The program will offer five days of meals on Mondays and Wednesdays from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. only throughout the summer break.

On Monday you will receive two breakfasts and two lunches for Monday and Tuesday meals, on Wednesday you will receive three breakfasts and three lunches for Wednesday, Thursday and Friday meals.

Please follow social distancing and remain in your vehicle. Food service staff will place meals in your unoccupied back seat or trunk.

Before she could offer her products for sale to the public, Steinbrenner had to submit them to the state Department of Agriculture for lab testing. "That way we can label them 'guaranteed analysis' (for protein, fat, fiber, and moisture),"








Slocum Volunteer Fire Company took delivery of a brand new 2019 Ford Braun 450 with auto litter ambulance on Friday August 2, 2019. The ambulance came with a price tag of \$202,000.

Besides the new ambulance the Fire Company received 12 new air packs and 1 RIT (rapid intervention teams) on July 31, 2019. The "Scott Air Packs" Oxygen Tanks SCBA (self-contained breathing apparatus) cost \$92,000 and were paid for through subscription drives, and other fundraisers. The Company also applied for grants.

# Fairview moves forward with basketball court renovations

Fairview Township supervisors at their June 2 meeting moved forward with renovations to the basketball courts at Memorial Park, but scrapped plans, at least for now, to install

a walking path around the soccer/baseball fields.

Supervisors awarded a \$62,720 contract to Chilewski Enterprises for the basketball court renovations. The firm was the lone bidder for the work. The township received a \$60,562 grant from the state Greenways, Trails and Recreation Program for the basket-

ball court renovations.

They voted to reject all bids for the construction of the approximately one-quarter mile walking path. Four bids were received for the walking path work. Bidders were Chilewski Enterprises, \$131,284.44; EBI LLC, \$149,176.00; Pioneer Construction Co., \$97,497.50; and Rutledge Excavating, \$135,805.

The lowest of the four bids for the walking path was nearly double the \$50,000 grant from the state Department of Community and Natural Resources that the township received for the project.

Board chairman Michael Iorio reported the township's summer park program is on hold.

#### **Doddo** resigns

Fairview supervisors accepted the resignation of zoning officer John Doddo effective June 16. They voted to appoint Carl Alber to the zoning officer position. Alber also is the Dallas Township zoning officer where he works Monday through Thursday. He will continue in that position and will have office hours in Fairview Township on Fridays from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. and evenings by appointment.

# MTHC receives unsolicited donations

Mountain Top Hose Company No. 1 President David Hourigan told Fairview supervisors the department has received numerous unsolicited dona-

tions, including a recent donation of \$1,000. "These donations are very welcome," Hourigan commented. He pointed out the department has participated in several birthday celebrations at the request of residents. He noted one parent whose child celebrated a birthday made a \$250 donation.

# COG compost site now open

The Mountain Top Council of Governments (COG) compost facility in the Crestwood Industrial Park opened on Wednesday, June 10. Hours are 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. on Wednesdays and 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Saturdays.

Permits are required to dump yard waste, and they

are available at the site for anyone who does not have a 2020 permit. Cost for permits is \$25 for Fairview Township residents and \$10 for Wright Township residents. There is no charge for permits for Wright Township residents 65 and older. Proof of residency is required. Wright Township supervisor Donald Zampetti said the township will make up the difference in the fee cost for its residents from its general fund budget.

The opening of the COG site was delayed because of the breakdown of a machine known as "The Beast" which is used to grind yard waste and branches. The machine broke down at the end of the 2019 season, leaving a great deal of waste that needed to be processed before the facility could open. Cost for parts needed to repair the machine was over \$10,000 which the COG treasury did not have until receiving 2020 contributions from Fairview and Wright Townships. Fairview Township roadmaster Tim McGinnis said repairs took township road crews much of the month of May to complete.

# Masks required at recycling centers

If you aren't willing to wear a mask and maintain social distancing at the Rice Township recycling center, stay away.

That was the message from township supervisors at their June 2 meeting after a situation in which employees had to deal with someone who was not willing to follow those rules. "This is to protect our employees and the public,"

supervisor Robert Pipech stated. "Social distancing and wearing a mask will be strictly enforced," he added.

The recycling center is open Wednesdays from 4 to 7 p.m. and Saturdays from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m.

Masks also are required at the Wright Township recycling center. Large signs are in place at the entrance to the center advising people that masks are required for entry. That center is open Saturdays from 7 a.m. to 2 p.m.

#### Rice opens park

Rice Township supervisors at their June 2 meeting voted to open the ball field and other open areas of the township park. Playground equipment will remain closed until the area is in a "green" condition to protect children.

#### In other news ...

The township is still trying to find a company to paint the new pickleball court. Engineer Andrew Pasonick reported he has contacted several firms but has not been able to find a company to do the work.

Pasonick reported work is progressing for the demolition of the former township fire company building. Last month supervisors awarded a \$28,600 contract to raze the building to Brdaric Excavation. The township received a \$62,950

grant from the Luzerne County office of Community Development for the project.

Supervisors approved the purchase of a roller from A&R Supply at a cost of \$9,800 and a tile-bed trailer from Wide World RV Center for \$4,350.


11:45 a.m. on Sunday, May 24. Well over 100 bikes and other vehicles showed up and left at noon to drive past Nico's house

turned three on May 26.






