

# Public hearing to be held on dirt bike track controversy

The Wright Township zoning hearing board will hold a public hearing August 3 at 7 p.m. on the four-year-old controversy over the operation of a dirt bike track in a rural area of the township.

The controversy began in the summer of 2016 when former township zoning officer Andrew Holter sent Mick and Melissa Gentilesco a violation letter which alleges they were operating a private recreational facility on their property. The letter was sent after Holter received complaints from neighbors about noise and dirt pollution emitting from a dirt bike/ATV track on the Gentliesco's property.

After a lengthy delay, the zoning board advertised that it would hold a hearing on April 9, 2018 on an application by the Gentilescos for a special exception to operate a private recreational facility on their property located in a conservation zoning district. However, the hearing never took place.

At that session, attorney Mark McNelis, representing the Gentilescos, took the position that the hearing was not about an application for special exception, but rather an appeal of the zoning officer's letter. He claimed they had appealed the zoning officer's violation letter and were entitled to a hearing. He insisted the township had the burden of proving the violation, rather than his client presenting the case for a special exception.

The zoning hearing board decided the Gentilescos were entitled to an appeal of the zoning officer's violation let-

ter. The board held hearings and voted 3-0 on July 17, 2018 to dismiss a notice of violation letter issued by Holter. The board decided the track, located on Yeager Road, does not constitute a private recreational facility, which would be a violation of the township's zoning ordinance.

The township subsequently voted to appeal its zoning board decision to Luzerne County Court.

Township solicitor Jack Dean reported last October that Judge Fred Pierantoni determined the township's zoning hearing board made an error in its decision regarding the case. The judge sent the matter back to the zoning hearing board.

Dean explained that the court's decision means it will be up to the Gentilescos to file an application for a special exception to use their property as a private recreational facility. In that case, Dean

emphasized, it will be up to the applicant to prove their case to the board to grant the special exception.

# Fairview Township awards paving contract

Fairview Township supervisors at their July 7 meeting awarded a contract for paving of Hazlenut Drive and Ridgecrest Drive to American Asphalt. The paving company bid \$186,990 to perform the work, the lowest of five bidders.

#### In other news ...

They also named Abby Wasiakowski as assistant secretary/treasurer at an hourly rate of \$19.50 with benefits effective August 3. They also appointed Larry Chapman as a fire police officer.

Northeast Signal and Electric Co. was hired to furnish labor, material, and equipment to perform annual preventative maintenance on the two signalized intersections in the township at a cost of \$1,370. The signalized intersections are Route 309 and Kirby Avenue and Route 309 and South Main Road.

Responding to concerns of a resident about speeding on North Main Street, supervisors said they will direct the police department to look into steps that can be taken, including placing a digital speed display machine on the street.



they retire before December 31, 2020.

At their July 13 meeting supervisors approved on a 3-2 vote a "voluntary employment separation plan."

To be eligible, employees must have 25 years of fulltime employment in the township or be age 60 or older with a minimum of five years employment. Employees who want to participate must submit a notice of separation by October 1 and retire by December 31. A \$10,000 incentive will be paid to the employee on their separation and a second \$10,000 on the one-year anniversary of their leaving.

The motion to approve the plan, which was not on the board's agenda, was made by supervisor Michael Marshall and seconded by Colleen Macko, Marshall, and board chairman Matthew Howton voted in favor of the resolution. Supervisors Donald Zampetti and Louis Welebob Jr. opposed it.

Solicitor Jack Dean said the plan is similar to that offered from time to time by school districts. He explained that the municipality can save money if it does not replace people who choose to leave. Even if it does replace employees who leave, the township could save money because replacements most likely would be hired at a lower salary.

Following the meeting, township secretary/treasurer Pam Heard said there are four employees who are eligible, two in the police department and two in public works. She would not release their names. However, responding to a sub-

sequent email inquiry, Heard said the plan is limited to those DPW workers in the laborer classification only.

Zampetti said he opposed the measure because he does not know what the measure will cost the township. Should four employees take the offer, their departure would cost the township \$80,000 in incentive over two years.

#### In other news ...

On that same 3-2 vote, supervisors added another street to the \$350,637.90 paving contract awarded to Barletta Materials last month. The pact awarded last month includes paving of Yorktown Road from Hitching Post Road to the southerly end; Red Coat Lane from Walden Drive up to dead end just past Colonels Ridge Road; the northerly portion of Rebel Hill Road; and White Tail Drive from South Main Road to Deer Run Drive.

At the time, they decided not to include Fawn Court, which would have cost another \$49.075.35. The motion to add Fawn Court was approved by a 3-2 vote with Welebob and Zampetti voting no. Welebob expressed concern last month that including Fawn Court would nearly drain the township's Liquid Fuels Fund which has a balance of \$412,365. When he asked at the July meeting what would be the source of the additional cost, he was told the money would come from either the general fund or capital reserve fund.

It doesn't look like the \$50,000 Wright Township has to refurbish its playground will go far. Earlier this year, the township received a \$25,000 grant from the state Department of Community and Natural Resources to upgrade its aging playground equipment.

The grant requires a \$25,000 local match.

Heard reported at the supervisors meeting that the township has had just one response so far from the request for proposals sent out through COSTARS to furnish and install playground equipment. She anticipates additional proposals by the July 31 deadline, she

At the June 23 recreation board meeting, Heard told board members that the quote to replace the climber in the

lower playground was close to \$70,000. While the cost for that equipment alone is \$20,000 more than in the budget, it's possible the township could obtain additional funding through a Luzerne County Community Development Block Grant.

At their July meeting, supervisors voted to return a Luzerne County Community Development Block Grant intended to raze a dilapidated home on Third Avenue. They said

### Combine miniature golf with some ice cream at Valley Scoops and More

When John Cara and his family purchased Valley Scoops and More in Conyngham back in 2015, he had a vision of how he wanted the business' miniature golf course to look.

Actually, it was his sons who had the vision.

"Whenever we went on vacation, we always took our children miniature golfing. They knew what it was supposed to look like," Cara explained.

So, over the last five years, Cara and his sons Brent and Matt have made many improvements to the scenic miniature golf course located along Route 93 in Conyngham. "The first thing we did was restore the running water," said Cara. "We then added chlorination and filtration systems," he explained. The water feeds a scenic waterfall, stream, and a

pond with a fountain throughout the 18-hole course laid out on a hillside, providing plenty of challenges for golfers.

Besides restoring the water, they replaced about 60 percent of the carpeting on the course, giving the scenic layout a fresh new look. Cara and his sons provided all the labor to remove the old carpeting and replace it with new material. He said he worked with Nick Bonomo of Bonomo's Floor covering in Hazleton to obtain the carpeting. "There is only

one company making carpeting for miniature golf courses right now," he noted. Recently, they removed a large boulder than had been placed on the third hole as an obstacle.

While his course is popular, and brings visitors from many surrounding communities, Cara acknowledged miniature golf has lost popularity over the years. "Miniature golf is going away," he explained. "You almost have to have a passion for it to keep it going." He pointed out it is difficult to find suppliers for balls and clubs. "Because of the water, we need balls that will float," he noted.

Cara pointed out that balls and clubs are sanitized after every use to keep customers safe from Covid-19.

While the golf course is popular, it's not the main attrac-

tion at Valley Scoops. It's the Leiby's Ice Cream that draws people to the Conyngham business. "We sell twice as much ice cream as food," Cara related. When the business first opened following the pandemic shutdown, they set up a drive-through for customers hungry for the ice cream. Recently, the ice cream and food business opened following CDC guidelines with social distancing emphasized.

Valley Scoops and More is located at 683 State Route 93, Sugarloaf Township (Conyngham). It is open Saturday and Sunday noon to 8 p.m. and weekdays 3 to 8 p.m. It is located next to Gould's Market. The supermarket was started in 1971 by Cara's father-in-law John Gould and Cara is the manager of the store.



### Crestwood High School graduates launch the JumpStart Cart to assist adults with autism

Two Crestwood High School graduates with more than 30 years of experience treating people with special needs have launched the JumpStart Cart to provide young adults with an opportunity to continue to build the skills they need to obtain and maintain employment within their local community.

Co-founders Jackie Elick, OTR/L, COO, of Slocum Township and Jess Light, CCC-SLP, CEO, of Bear Creek, established the nonprofit organization in 2019 after noticing the shortage of available resources and services for adults 21 years of age and older.

"We saw firsthand what happens when our former students graduate and age out of the educational system at 21," said Elick, a licensed occu-

pational therapist. "Jess and I would discover that our former students were at home with little to no participation in their community. This also posed difficulties for parents

and caregivers that continue to work daily."

"Our mission is to educate and train adults with special needs to integrate and function independently in the community by acquiring life and employment skills," Light, a licensed speech-language pathologist, added. "We hope this specialized program will offer the support needed to further develop life and employment skills and promote successful career opportunities."

Once operational, the Jump-Start Cart will address that shortage of ongoing support and services their clients need throughout their lifespan. It will provide vocational and community living skills training for up to four young adults who have been diagnosed with a disorder on the autism spectrum or special needs. The organization's founders and community volunteers outline intentions to continue growing the fledgling nonprofit in their business plan.

In six months, the nonprofit envisions up to eight employees and increasing the number of people it serves further to about 16 after its first year of operation. A second food truck with up to 24 total employees is planned for the second year of operation.

The food truck will be staffed by community volunteers, including Elick and/or Light, once fundraising is complete. The operation will be stationed at farmers markets, outdoor festivals, and other special community events. The menu will feature rotating signature panini sandwiches, including vegetarian and vegan options, pasta salad, a smoked deviled egg and soft drink to complete the meal.

# Dollar General clears some hurdles in Rice Township

While the business is a permitted use in the B-2 zone, the conditional use approval was required because the township Subdivision and Land Development Ordinance (SALDO), requires that any land dis-

turbance exceeding 80,000 square feet and any building/impervious area exceeding 20,000 square feet obtain approval of supervisors.

At their regular meeting that followed the public hearing, supervisors approved the subdivision application conditioned on the developer meeting outstanding items recommended by the township planning commission. They also granted preliminary approval to the land development application conditioned on receipt of all outstanding permits recommended by the planning commission.







mended supervisors grant final approval of the subdivision application conditioned on it meeting certain outstanding items. They also recommended supervisors grant preliminary approval of the land development application conditioned on receipt of all outstanding permits as noted in the township engineer's comments.

Solicitor Jack Dean pointed out the developer still must submit final land development plans to the planning commission for approval.

#### In other news ...

Supervisors approved ordinances authorizing participation of the township police

department in the Luzerne County Driving Under the Influence Task Force and the Luzerne County Drug Task Force.

Secretary/Treasurer Jeff Beck reported the zoning office has more than \$1,700 income for June, the most for one month in the last four or five years. Beck attributed the higher

than usual income to increased applications for swimming pool receipts.

Beck reported township income over the first six months of the year was slightly ahead of projection, due in part to higher earned income tax receipts. He noted income from property transfer taxes was behind.

Supervisor Bob Pipech, township roadmaster, said road crews are finishing up milling and patching work on Ice Harvest Road. He said he will recommend the township advertise for bids for double tar and chip and fog sealing the road. The process was used successfully on other township roads last year.
