They started the week by coordinating with the





## Covid-19 has severe impact on WTVFD

The Covid-19 pandemic has had a severe impact on Wright Twp. Volunteer Fire Company finances.

Fire Chief Dave Pettit, in his July report to township supervisors, reported the department's inability to conduct its annual bazaar because of the virus and loss of hall rental income have cost the volunteer organization over \$30,000, money it will not be able to recover.

The fire chief added that coupled with Covid-19 expenses, the department has absorbed a \$45,000 financial hit. "Our annual vehicle maintenance budget is 100% over the typical budgeted amount due to unexpected breakdowns," Pettit reported. He said the department has applied for grant funding to alleviate the financial burden of dealing with Covid-19, but any grants

received will not make up for loss of fund-raising revenue. "Fund raising money that is not raised is never recuperated," Pettit stated.

Pettit noted in his report that members of the department met with board chairman Matt Howton to discuss its finances. He said he would have more information on the department's financial picture for the supervisors' August meeting.

The township's implemented a .2 mill fire tax for 2020 which is expected to generate \$109,362 revenue which will go directly to the fire department. However, the tax revenue is intended to take the place of the township's annual contribution to the fire department which was approximately \$100,000.

Last December, in his monthly report to supervisors, Pettit told supervisors that the .2 mill fire tax would "seriously negatively affect the department in every way possible."

"The department will be crippled by the (fire tax) level proposed as it will be replacing the current amount already contributed but will not include the amount received via donations and contributions," Pettit wrote. "The negative impact from this will cause serious issues moving forward and does not help the Wright Township community or the department," he warned.

The fire department, with the assistance of township police, is moving forward with its business information collection project. The form is intended to help emergency services and local government better communicate with businesses in the township.

The information being collected includes location and type of business/industry, hours of operation, how access is gained to the property, and a list of emergency contacts.

## Wright Township grants special exception

The Wright Township zoning board recently granted a special exception requested by Carole Myron, 288 S. Main Road, to operate a daycare at her residence. The approval came with some conditions. Hours are limited to 6 a.m. to 7 p.m.; a maximum of 12 children at any one time; she must

construct a fence around the outside play area; and comply with all township zoning laws. **In other news ...** 

Wright Township supervisors voted unanimously to appoint Steve Gothreau to fill a vacancy on the township planning commission.

During the Wright Township supervisors' work session, a lengthy discussion was held

#### **COG faces more** equiptment maintenance costs

The Mountain Top Council of Governments (COG) continues to face equipment maintenance costs. A few weeks ago, the COG was forced to spend over \$10,000 for parts to repair the "Beast," a huge piece of equipment used to grind yard waste. At last month's COG board meeting, president Don Zampetti reported tires on the Bobcat need replacement at an estimated cost of \$1,700.

Zampetti also reported the COG has submitted an invoice for \$2,025 to Wright Township for annual permits sold by the COG to township residents for less than the \$25 fee set by the board in January. Township supervisors voted to charge township residents \$10 for annual permits and free for senior citizens. The COG has taken the position the township must reimburse it for those permits sold for less than \$25. Fairview Township charges its residents \$25 for the annual permit.

#### Rice moving forward with road repairs

Rice Township officials are moving forward with plans to double tar and chip Ice Harvest Road. Supervisors have advertised for bids for the project which includes 1.6 miles of double tar and chip with asphalt fog. Township public works crews have been working on the road the last few weeks preparing for the project. Crews used the township's new backhoe to mill sections of the road in need of repair. Those areas were patched

#### **Wyoming Seminary to** open on August 31

Wyoming Seminary College Preparatory School, with campuses in Forty Fort and Kingston, will open for in-person and on-line classes on Monday, August 31.

The school, which includes grades toddler through eighth grades at Lower School in Forty Fort and ninth through twelfth and postgraduate grades at the Upper School in Kingston, will offer parents the option of choosing in-person classes with social distancing, or online classes.

If state officials mandate the closing of schools due to an increase in the coronavirus pandemic, Wyoming Seminary will move to on-line classes as soon as possible.

The school's detailed opening plan is the result of several months of work by task forces focusing on academics, athletics, enrollment and finances, health and sanitation, and residential life, said Kevin P. Rea, Wyoming Seminary president.

Rea noted that the school's plan reflects its expectations for returning to school based on current conditions, and that the school may need to revise its plan if conditions change.

In compliance with Pennsylvania Governor Tom Wolf's order mandating wearing masks in public and the Center for Disease Control's guidance, all faculty, staff, students and visitors to campus will wear masks or face shields. The school is converting large spaces on both campuses into

classroom spaces and will manage lunch periods to maintain social distancing. Desk plexiglass guards will be used in classrooms where classwork may bring students and faculty within six feet of each other.

Wyoming Seminary has developed an app for computers and mobile devices that will be used daily by all students, faculty and staff to track and report symptoms of illness. The school also has established a new expanded student health center at the Upper School and has increased health professional staffing and CDC-recommended, hospital-grade personal protection equipment on both campuses.

The school has expanded its cleaning and sanitizing protocols in keeping with CDC guidelines and contracted for additional cleaning services.

Hand sanitizer stations will be installed in key locations throughout all buildings.

All visitors will be masked and will maintain social distancing. Parent and visitor access to buildings will be limited and all are asked to make appointments.



#### I have a right-to-know but they won't tell me

Dear Editor,

On June 23, 2020, I was notified by a neighbor regarding an article in the June 3, 2020 edition of the Mountain Eagle, referencing discussions at a May 14, 2020 Crestwood School District (CSD) school board meeting. The section relating to the use of the secondary campus land (on Rt. 309) for the placement of Rinehimer Bus Co.'s school buses and erection of a 3-stall garage, is what prompted his call to me.

Once I verified the publication, I contacted the Wright Township Municipal Bldg. and was advised that they knew nothing about this and referred me to CSD.

An email was sent to both CSD and Wright Township (their respective secretaries) asking for the email to be forwarded to all elected school board members and elected township supervisors. The emails addressed a few simple questions and my concerns as a homeowner and taxpayer. No response received. I sent a follow up email on July 1, with still no response other than the township stating again that they knew nothing. On July 1. I also sent (certified mail) a Right-To-Know form to CSD. On July 15 CSD issued me a Right-To-Know Form Extension of Time. On July 20 CSD issued me an Attestation of Nonexistence of Records.

Nonexistence of records? Not possible unless CSD Superintendent, Robert Mehalick, came up with this idea, on his own, in the middle of a school board meeting. On July 23 I sent, again by certified mail, an Appeal to Attestation of Nonexistence of Records.

What is now so hush about this proposal? In 2010, CSD utilized our tax dollars to purchase the properties associated with this area of land, to include demolition of houses, debris clean up, and restoration of the land. Now they

want to allow a for-profit, commercial entity, to park its diesel run buses, service and wash them in a 3-stall garage, on public school property. The financial and environmental implications are many.


