News in Brief ...

July 4th parade plans submitted to townships

Fairview Township supervisors reported at their February meeting that the township received a request from Mountain Top Area Community Association (MACA) to hold an Independence Day parade.

The application letter, submitted by MACA secretary Dr. Mark Bohn, told supervisors

the organization is planning the parade for Saturday, July 3 with a rain date of July 5. The request included MACA's application to PennDOT to close sections of Route 309 and South Main Road for the parade; insurance coverage; and a request to Crestwood School District for use of the secondary campus parking lot for a post-parade ceremony. The parade would disband at the Wright Township munici-

g pal building.

Supervisors did not take any action on the request.


Mountain Top on The Move, which conducted the parade for three decades, submitted a letter to Wright Township in January asking for township approval to hold the parade. The township did not act on the request. Board chairman Matthew Howton told MTOTM president Dianne Hopersberger at the January meeting that the organization needed to submit a Covid-19 plan as well and must submit an application to PennDOT for use of the highway.

As of the February 2 supervisors meeting, MTOTM had not submitted an application to Fairview Township to hold its parade. Mike Iorio, chairman of Fairview Township supervisors, said he wanted to talk to leadership of MTOTM about its plans before the board makes a decision.

A dispute among members of MTOTM in 2019 over direction the organization was taking, and election of officers led to some MTOTM members forming MACA. Both organizations planned to hold parades last year, but because of the Covid-19 pandemic, both cancelled parade plans.

Zoning appeal fees raised in Fairview

Fairview Township supervisors voted to increase fees for zoning appeals. The fee for an appeal to the zoning hearing board for a variance

In other news ...

Also approved was a resolution to borrow \$34,000 from First Keystone Bank to purchase a new Ford Explorer police vehicle. The SUV is expected to cost \$48,000 and the township budgeted \$14,000 for the purchase in its 2021 budget.

Patricia Iorio was appointed to a five-year term on the Mountain Top Joint Sanitary Authority.

Secretary/Treasurer Abby Wasiakowski read a proclamation from the U.S. Census Bureau commending the township for its efforts to make the 2020 census a success.



bike/ATV track on the Gentilesco's property.

After a lengthy delay, the zoning board advertised that it would hold a hearing on April 9, 2018 on an application by the Gentilescos for a special exception to operate a private recreational facility on their property located in a conservation zoning district. However, the hearing never took place.

At that session, attorney Mark McNelis, representing the Gentilescos, took the position that the hearing was not about an application for special exception, but rather an appeal of the zoning officer's letter. He claimed they had appealed the zoning officer's violation letter and were entitled to a hearing. He insisted the township had the burden of proving the violation, rather than his client presenting the case for a special exception.

The zoning hearing board decided the Gentilescos were entitled to an appeal of the zoning officer's violation letter. The board held hearings and voted 3-0 on July 17, 2018 to dismiss a notice of violation letter issued by Holter. The board decided the track, located on Yeager Road, does not constitute a private recreational facility, which would be a violation of the township's zoning ordinance.

The township subsequently voted to appeal its zoning board decision to Luzerne County Court.

Township solicitor Jack Dean reported that Judge Fred Pierantoni determined the township's zoning hearing board made an error in its decision regarding the case. The judge sent the matter back to the zoning hearing board.

As a result of the judge's decision, it was up to the Gentilescos to file an application

for a special exception to use their property as a private recreational facility.

"I am truly honored and excited because this gives me a greater voice for each and



it is critical that they have fair wages, benefits and safe work environments."

The Labor and Industry Committee reviews legislation on issues such as the state's minimum wage, unemployment compensation, workers' compensation, building and construction codes, and workplace health and safety. The committee is responsible for oversight of the Department of Labor and Industry, State Civil Service Commission, Labor Relations Board, Unemployment Compensation Appeals Board of Review, Industrial Board, Workers' Compensation Appeal Board, and the Office for the Deaf and Hearing Impaired.

Residents urged to clear fire hydrants

Local fire company leaders urge residents to keep fire hydrants near their homes clear of snow, particularly after big storms.

Mountain Top Hose Company No. 1 President David Hourigan pointed out that even if the hydrant isn't directly in front of your home, it's important to make sure it's accessible. "It should be a neighbor thing," Hourigan explained. "A hydrant serves a wide area 1,000 to 1,200 feet in either direction. It is important that they are accessible when seconds count," he added.

Wright Township Fire Chief Dave Pettit said his department also is asking residents to clear snow away from hydrants. Pettit said if someone is not able to remove snow that may be blocking a hydrant, they should contact the department. "We will be making every attempt, time permitting, to assist residents who cannot (remove snow from around hydrants)," Pettit said. The Wright Township chief said that depending on availability of members, the department will be clearing around hydrants over the next week or two anticipating more snow.

Hourigan also asks that residents help keep first responders safe by keeping sidewalks and driveways clear of snow and ice. "People can really help all first responders by keeping their walks/driveways clear as responders are really at risk in icy conditions," he noted.

Also Rice Township supervisor Bob Pipech, at the most recent supervisors meeting, reminded residents that the police department asks residents to remove all portable basketball hoops and refrain from parking on township roads or rights-of-way during storms for safe removal of snow. The supervisor said vehicles parked on township roads have created problems for snowplow crews.

Court denies Dorrance application

Commonwealth Court has denied an application by Dorrance Township to re-argue its appeal of a decision by a threejudge panel regarding the Preserve at Blue Ridge Trail. The one-sentence decision was issued February 11.

Last December, a three-judge panel of the Commonwealth Court upheld a decision by the Luzerne County Court that overturned Dorrance Township's denial of the Preserve at Blue Ridge Trail's application

to build a planned residential community (PRD) around the existing Blue Ridge Trail golf course.

The Preserve plans to develop approximately 135 acres of its 546-acre property as single-family dwellings on one acre lots. A planned residential development allows a developer to meet overall density and land-use goals without being bound by rigid zoning requirements such as minimum lot size and use categories.

Rice Township won't sell firehall property

Rice Township supervisors made it clear at their February 9 meeting that they do not intend to sell the former township volunteer fire hall property.

That message was in response to an inquiry from township resident Steve Pantalone who told supervisors he is

interested in the property as a site for a restaurant.

"We have no interest in selling the property," board chairman Bob Pipech told Pantalone. The township last year received a grant from the Luzerne County Officer of Community Development which it used to demolish the former fire hall at a cost \$28,600.

Supervisor Rick Arnold said the township would like to build a community center/ senior center on the property. He suggested that if that happens, the township might consider leasing a part of the property for a restaurant to complement the community center.

Last month, supervisors voted to lease the western section and rear eastern section of the property to First Light Cable for \$2,250.00 per month, to expire on January 31, 2022. The township also leases the front part of the property along Nuangola Road to the Ice House Pub.

Police officer position will not to be filled until June

It looks like it will be at least June before Wright Township hires another full-time police officer. At their recent meeting, supervisors acknowledged receipt of a letter from Police Chief Royce Engler asking supervisors to appoint a fulltime police officer but did not take any action on the request. The township currently has six full-time officers. When officer Brian Macko retired last summer, the township did not fill his full-time position, rather it hired a part-time officer.

Supervisors did agree to Engler's recommendation to allow part-time officer Bran-




