spring clean up will be held the week of May 3-8. Township employees will pick up large items at residences for a fee on May 3 and 4. Dumpsters will be available behind the municipal building to deposit items on

Wednesday, May 5 from 7 a.m. to 4 p.m. and on Thursday and Friday, May 6 through 7 from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. and on Saturday, May 8 from 7 a.m. to 4 p.m.

There is a fee of \$10 for each large item such as couches, mattresses, grills, lawn tractors, etc.

No construction materials, paint cans, automotive parts, propane tanks or hazardous materials will be accepted. No electronic items will be accepted. Wright Township will hold a separate electronics recycling event on Saturday, August 7.

Residents can bring items to the dumpsters at the rear of the municipal building May 5-8. No items will be accepted without pre-paid permits. Permits must be obtained in advance from the supervisor's office.

Drop off permit fee schedule:

\$5 for cars each visit; \$10 for pickups and/or trailers each visit; \$25 commercial trucks each visit.

Additional drop off fees: \$20 for each refrigerator, freezer, dehumidifier, or air conditioner; \$10 for each washer, dryer, dishwasher, stove or water heater; \$2 for each car tire, all tires must be off rims; \$4 for each 16" tire, all tires must be off rims; \$8 for each 16.5" tire, all tires must be off rims; \$2 for

motorcycle tires. No one will be allowed to deposit items unless they have a permit.

This annual clean up is for Wright Township residents only. Proof of residency required. Allowable items: microwave, vacuum, sofa, chair, grill (no propane tanks), lawn mower, treadmill, dry-wall, patio door, fiberglass.

Crestwood scoreboard dedicated in memory of John Matthew Dean as baseball is welcomed back

The Crestwood School District dedicated a new scoreboard and welcomed baseball back to the secondary campus on April 23 prior to its boys baseball game against Wyoming Valley West.

The scoreboard was dedicated in memory of the late John Matthew Dean who passed away in 1998 at age four and one-half after a courageous battle with brain cancer. Dean was the son of John and Lisa Dean of Glen Summit.

“Mountain Top has been so good to us, we wanted to give something back to the community,” said John Dean, who is the school district’s solicitor. “When Crestwood brought baseball back to the second-

ary campus, we decided to donate the scoreboard in our son’s memory,” he added. The Deans’ younger son, Matthew, a senior at Crestwood, is one of the captains of this year’s Comets. He plays third base and pitches.

The boys baseball team resumed playing at the field on the secondary campus this year after playing at the American Legion field in Rice Township for the last 10 years. Four members of the district’s board of education, Barry Boone, president; Anna Bibla, Lauren McCurdy and Randy Swank, threw out ceremonial first pitches prior to the game.

News in Brief ...

Dormant development could see new life

A Mountain Top housing development that has sat idle for more than a decade after the construction of just a handful of homes may soon get a new owner, and with that new life.

Tuskes Homes of Bethlehem is negotiating the purchase of The Sanctuary in Wright Township from W-Cat, Inc. with plans to build 72 homes on the parcel located along Church Road.

Michael Tuskes, vice president of Tuskes Homes, said his company needs to get approvals from local and state agencies before the sale is finalized and construction begins. Meanwhile, Tuskes, as equitable owner, is advertising for the sale of new homes in the long-dormant development which will be called HillCrest Estates at Mountain Top.

W-Cat Inc. bought the 37-acre property in 2002 from Bishop James C. Timlin as trustee for St. Jude's Church. In November 2004, the Wright

Township planning commission granted W-Cat preliminary approval to construct the 86-townhouse development. While roads and utilities were installed, only seven units were built and just two sold.

The first step to revitalizing the development, Tuskes said, is for the builder to present revised development plans to the Wright Township planning commission. He is hopeful the project can get on the planning commission's agenda with-

in the next two months. He noted the roads, curbs, water, and sewer lines are in place, though the stormwater management system will have to be updated to meet current standards. The state Department of Environmental Protection also will have to give its approval before work can begin.

Tuskes said the company's plans call for construction of a mix of townhouses, small and large single-family

homes. He estimated the cost of townhomes will be in the high \$200,000 range; smaller single-family homes anywhere from \$350,000 to \$400,000; and larger single-family homes (3,200 square-feet) at approximately \$500,000. He emphasized that skyrocketing costs of building materials make it difficult to accurately predict cost of new construction. At best, Tuskes said, it would be six to eight months before construction of homes could begin.

Tuskes said he could not

disclose the purchase price. "There still are a lot of moving parts," he said of negotiations.

Local realtor David Hourigan is excited about the prospects of renewed development of the property. "The new ownership will bring renewed interest in the development," said Hourigan, broker/owner of Century 21 Smith-Hourigan Group. The veteran realtor pointed out the housing market in the Mountain Top area is very short on inventory and the demand is strong. "Adding new homes

will help offset the short supply of homes and meet the needs of people seeking a home in our great community," Hourigan predicted. "I wish Tuskes Homes well with their venture."

Wright Township supervisor Matthew Howton said he is happy the property that has been dormant for so long is finally moving forward. "I'm happy that in this atmosphere we're getting this positive news," the board chairman commented.

A third-generation home builder, Tuskes Homes has been building homes in the Lehigh Valley and Poconos for more than 50 years. Locally, Tuskes has built more than 500 units at the Sand Springs Golf Course. It also developed Golden Oaks Village, a 55-plus community along Route 940 in White Haven.

W-Cat Inc., originally was formed by disgraced attorney Robert Powell and Jill Moran,

Wright Township addressing noise complaints

Wright Township officials assured Fairview Township residents they are addressing noise complaints emanating from the Crestwood Industrial Park.

A contingent of Fairview Township residents attended the April 6 meeting of Fairview Township supervisors to ask for help with a loud noise from a plant in the industrial park that is keeping them awake at night. The supervisor promised to contact Wright Township officials about the problem since the park is in that municipality.

Wright Township supervisor Donald Zampetti, liaison to the zoning office, reported at the April 12 board meeting that he contacted zoning officer Tim Dow about the issue. Zampetti said the zoning officer determined the source of the noise to be Berry Plastics located on Elmwood Avenue. Township secretary/treasurer Pam Heard reported Dow went to the plant earlier in the day and spoke to

the plant manager about the noise complaints.

Gene Vivaldi, spokesman for neighbors in the Bow Creek development, which is affected by the noise, asked supervisors who neighbors could contact when the noise is at its worst during early morning hours. Board chairman Matthew Howton told Vivaldi he would provide him with his contact information.

In other news ...

Howton reported the township has put its new leaf collection truck in service. He emphasized only leaves will be collected and must be raked

to the edge of the roadway. "It's just for leaves, not shrubs, grass or sticks," Howton emphasized. He said residents can contact the township office to have leaves collected. He pointed out residents can bring other yard waste to the Mountain Top COG compost site in the industrial park. Supervisors passed a motion setting the cost of COG permits for township residents at \$10 and free for residents 65 and over.

Supervisors approved a background check policy that applies to employees and volunteers who have direct contact with children.

They also authorized Heard to advertise an amendment to

the stormwater ordinance to increase permit fees. Supervisors explained engineering review of permit applications cost the township as much as \$800 while the current fee schedule is \$50 to \$100.

The fate of annual July 4 parade remains up in the air

Despite an admonition last month from Wright Township supervisors to come to a compromise or face the possibility

there will not be a parade, representatives of Mountain Top Area Community Association (MACA) and Mountain Top on the Move (MTOM) told supervisors at their April 12 meeting that they have not reached an agreement.

As it turned out, neither could township supervisors.

Tracy Cornelius, president of MACA, told supervisors during their work session that her organization sent a proposal to MTOM president Dianne Hoppersberger offering to alternate

years sponsoring the parade with MTOM being the sponsor in 2021 and MACA next year. Cornelius said she received a counterproposal that had nothing to do with the parade but focused on a post-parade festival.

Asked by supervisor Matthew Howton if MTOM would accept the proposal to alternate years, Hoppersberger's response was an unequivocal "no."

"It's financially not feasible (for MTOM)," the organization president stated. "We would lose funding and sponsors," she explained. "After 35 years, it's inconceivable to think of another organization doing it," Hoppersberger said of the idea of alternating years with MACA. "Our fundraising would be crippled."

During the board's regular meeting, Cornelius told supervisors her group feels alternating years would be a good idea.

When it was apparent a compromise between the groups could not be reached, Howton made a motion to approve MTOM's application to hold the parade this year and for MACA to sponsor the event in 2022, alternating years. Essentially, it was the proposal made by MACA. The motion, seconded by supervisor Colleen Macko,

failed on a 2-2 tie vote. Howton and Macko voted in favor while supervisors Louis Welebob Jr. and Donald Zampetti voted no. Supervisor Mike Marshall was absent.

"There's no decision," a frustrated Howton said after the vote.

Another July 4 Mountain Top tradition, the Wright Township fireworks display, also is still up in the air. The board chairman said he contacted ZY Pyrotechnics, Schaefer Pyrotechnics and Zambelli Fireworks for prices to put on the annual display. He said Zambelli declined to bid while he has not heard back from ZY Pyrotechnics and Schaefer Pyrotechnics.

Pennsy Supply wants to expand hours

Pennsy Supply has asked Dorrance Township supervi-

sors for permission to expand hours of operation at its quarry on Small Mountain Road, a request that has caused concern among township officials.

Supervisors received a letter from Paul Yankanich, Pennsy Supply operations manager, who told them that a significant increase in commercial construction in the Hazleton area has resulted in what he described as a "fortunate increase in business." To meet the demand, Yankanich said the company would like permission to expand its hours of operation to 7 a.m. to 9 p.m., Monday through Friday. The quarry currently operates from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. The company also wants to temporarily bring in a small portable crusher to be used near the working face of its mining operation to help meet the demand for materials.

At their April meeting, supervisors tabled vote on the request until they can get information on the anticipated decibel level of the noise from the additional crusher and the length of time for which the company wants to extend its

hours of operation. Supervisors did agree that 9 p.m. is too late for operation of the quarry.

The hours of operation of the quarry were set by supervisors and a memorandum of zoning conditions with the approved hours and maintenance agreements was recorded at the Luzerne County Courthouse at the time of approval in 2013.

In other news ...

Supervisors voted to apply for a highway occupancy permit (HOP) from PennDOT for the Liberty Travel Plaza, Blue Ridge Trail project. The agent is Greenman-Pedersen, Inc. Supervisors said all required agreements have been completed and signed and the bond issued.

Supervisors approved a request from Joe Stachokus, project engineer, to begin work on the project which has been delayed nearly a year awaiting PennDOT approval. The engineer assured supervisors that any risk in beginning construction is on the property owner contingent on the receipt of the HOP which they anticipate will be approved.

Wright Township approves insurance package

Wright Township supervisors at their April meeting approved an insurance package proposed by DGK Insurance that will save the township \$21,213 compared to the current policies that expire at the end of the month.

The bulk of the savings, \$15,570, will come from combining the township employees and the volunteer fire department workman's compensation insurance into one policy. DGK representative Jeff Kyle explained that until recently, insurance carriers were reluctant to provide workman's compensation coverage for fire departments due to requirements of the Cancer Presumption Act, forcing municipalities to obtain coverage through the state's program.

Kyle had more good news for supervisors. He reported the township will receive a \$17,958.79 dividend from the firm's workman's compensation insurance consortium.

Dorrance holding spring clean up

Dorrance Township will hold its annual spring cleanup on Saturday, May 1, from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. behind the municipal garage. The cleanup will be limited to township residents and proof of residency will be required. Fees will be \$15 for carload; \$20 for small pickup trucks and pull behind trailer loads; \$50 for trucks over three-quarter ton. There will be additional fees for batteries, white appliances, and tires. Freon must be removed from

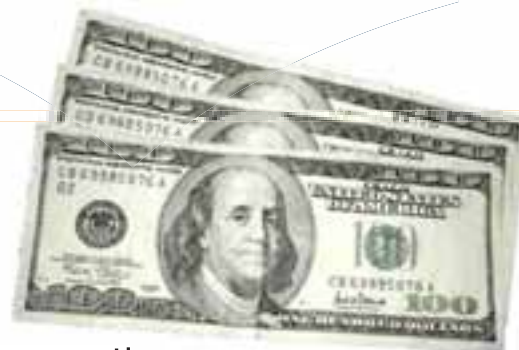

refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners and dehumidifiers or they will not be accepted. Tires must be removed from rims and tractor-trailer tires will not be accepted.

Electronic devices, asbestos, shingles, wood, paint cans, propane tanks, household garbage or any hazardous materials will not be accepted.

Wright Township sets spring clean up

Wright Township's annual spring clean up will be held the week of **May 3-8**. Township employees will pick up large items at residences for a fee on May 3 and 4. Dumpsters will be available behind the municipal building to deposit items on Wednesday, May 5 from 7 a.m. to 4 p.m. and on Thursday and Friday, May 6 through 7 from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. and on Saturday, May 8 from 7 a.m. to 4 p.m.

There is a fee of \$10 for each large item such as couches, mattresses, grills, lawn tractors, etc.

No construction materials, paint cans, automotive parts, propane tanks or hazardous materials will be accepted. No electronic items will be accepted. Wright Township will hold a separate electronics recycling event on Saturday, August 7.

Residents can bring items to the dumpsters at the rear of the municipal building May 5-8. No items will be accepted without pre-paid permits. Permits must be obtained in advance from the supervisor's office.

Drop off permit fee schedule: \$5 for cars each visit; \$10 for pickups and/or trailers each

visit; \$25 commercial trucks each visit.

Additional drop off fees: \$20 for each refrigerator, freezer, dehumidifier, or air conditioner; \$10 for each washer, dryer, dishwasher, stove or water heater; \$2 for each car tire, all tires must be off rims; \$4 for each 16" tire, all tires must be off rims; \$8 for each 16.5" tire, all tires must be off rims; \$2 for motorcycle tires. No one will be allowed to deposit items unless they have a permit.

This annual clean up is for Wright Township residents only. Proof of residency required. Allowable items: microwave, vacuum, sofa, chair, grill (no propane tanks), lawn mower, treadmill, drywall, patio door, fiberglass.

WTVFD will be site of public hearing

Wright Township zoning hearing board will hold a public hearing May 3 at 6 p.m. at

the Wright Township Volunteer Fire Hall to deal with the more than four-year-old controversy over the operation of a dirt bike track in a rural area of the township. The hearing was scheduled for March 4 at the municipal building, but was postponed to find a larger venue.

Mullery lauds \$1.4M in grant funding

State Rep. Gerald Mullery, D-Luzerne, announced over \$1.43 million in state funding has been awarded for several infrastructure and rehabilitation projects in the 119th Legislative District.

Wright Township will receive \$685,984 to widen Park Road, a heavily traveled roadway, and create a new bike lane, add curbs and a sidewalk, make stormwater improvements, remove trees and resurface the road and install pavement markings.

Mullery urges county tourism and visitor's bureau relocation to White Haven

Following media reports recently of Luzerne County Council considering relocation of the county tourism and visitors' bureau to Wilkes-Barre city's yet developed Central Railroad Station, state Rep. Gerald Mullery, D-Luzerne, sent the council members a letter recommending the White Haven Community Library & Visitor Center as an alternate option.


Mullery noted the White Haven property, originally constructed in 1889 as an engine repair shop for the for-

mer Lehigh Valley Railroad, has been deemed eligible for inclusion in the National Registry of Historic Buildings and has been dramatically transformed into a viable multi-purpose library and heritage visitor center.

Mullery cited commonwealth data indicating nearly 1 million people visited Hickory Run, Lehigh Gorge, and Nescopeck State Parks over the past two years and said White Haven Borough is considered the entrance community for all three parks.

Mullery is asking the Luzerne County Council to give the option their full consideration and is also inviting them for an on-site visit to see the facility.

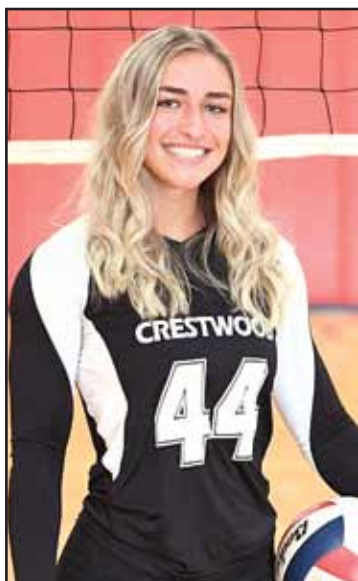

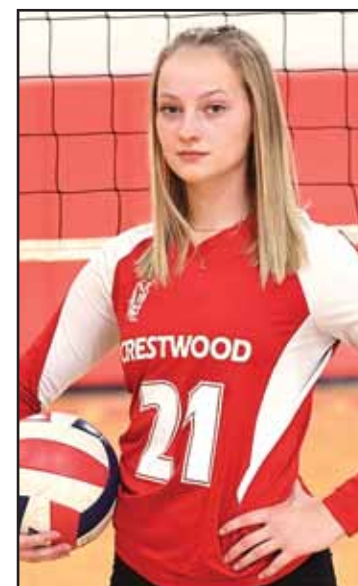

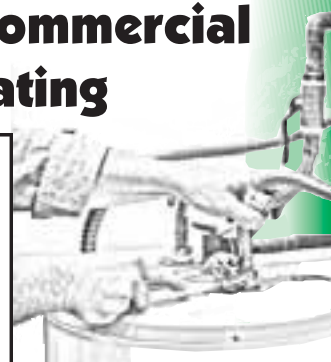
