Kallista Publishing.

The Crestwood High School graduate suffered traumatic brain injury in 2001 when he was assaulted at a party at Nuangola. As a result of the assault, he had a significant portion of his brain removed, forcing him to re-learn how to walk and talk at age 18.

Warner also has had severe obsessive compulsive disorder (OCD) since age 5, struggled with bipolar disorder since he was a teenager, and debilitating back pain.

Yet, despite all these challenges, the 42-yearold Warner now is a therapist in upstate New York working with individuals to help them overcome "I'm not trying to trumpet what I've been through and what I've accomplished," Warner said of his book. "Rather," he said in a recent interview, 'it's about helping people realize that despite what may seem like impossible odds they can make something of themselves." The book, he related, is about help-

ing people "make their

yoke lighter."

their own issues.


Though his bachelor's degree from King's College was in English, Warner felt himself drawn to social work. Having known and felt suffering, he said he developed empathy for others facing similar obstacles.

The title of his book, "Victory in Every Fall:
The Antaeus Approach to Overcoming Disabilities," really is descriptive of the importance of the help it offers to people facing what they may perceive as disabilities in their lives.

In Greek Mythology, Antaeus was a giant who was said to reside in Libya. He was the son of the sea god Poseidon and the Earth goddess Gaea and he compelled all strangers who were passing through the country to wrestle with him. Whenever Antaeus touched the Earth (which was his mother), his strength was renewed, so that even if thrown to the ground, he was invincible.

Warner's 256-page guide to overcoming life's greatest challenges, the author explained, is meant to help people like himself gain strength when they've been "thrown to the ground." The book offers readers a groundbreaking approach to resilience: every time life knocks you down, it's an opportunity to rise stronger than before.

Most readers, he explained, can use this approach to overcome their own obstacles. "I do it every day," Warner said of his own life. And through his work he has become proficient in helping people become stronger when they have what they consider





# Wright Center to offer full care and routine vaccination clinics in **Hazleton throughout December**

The Wright Center for Community Health is bringing its Driving Better Health mobile medical and dental unit to the Hazleton area in December to support the health and well-being of the community through a series of clinics.

Mobile full care clinics will take place from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Tuesday, Dec. 3, and Tuesday, Dec. 17, at the Hazleton Area School District administration building, located at 1515 W. 23rd St., Hazle Township. These clinics are tailored for school-age children and college students, offering school and sports physicals, vaccinations, and well visits. Appointments are required for these services.

Vaccination clinics for the general public will be available on Wednesday, Dec. 10, at the Hazleton Area School District administration building, 10 a.m. to 2 p.m., and Wednesdays, Dec. 4 and Dec. 18, at Hazleton Integration Project, 225 E. 4th St., Hazleton, 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.

These clinics will provide routine vaccinations. including flu, COVID-19, chickenpox, TDAP (tetanus, diphtheria, and pertussis), meningococcal, Hepatitis B, and HPV.

While walk-up appointments are welcome based on vaccine availability, scheduling an appointment is recommended for convenience.

Any individual younger than 17 must be accompanied by a parent or guardian. Guests are asked to bring identification and insurance cards.

#### Wright Township hockey rink to receive upgrades

A grant from the state Department of Conservation and Natural Resources' (DCNR) Community Conservation Partnerships Program (C2P2) announced recently by Rep. Alec Ryncavage (R-Luzerne) will help Wright Twp. begin to implement one of the major parts of its park master plan adopted last year - a Dek hockey surface for the Madry-Kahlau Memorial Ice Rink.

The township will receive \$145,000 that will be used to construct a Dek hockey court and improve pedestrian walkways and ADA access.

"Wright Township Recreation Area is a staple for family fun and outdoor adventures - a true one-stop shop for families to make memories on the mountain," Ryncavage said. "I'm incredibly grateful to see this funding come to our community."

One of the important phases of the master plan is changes to the rink. The plan includes a proposed reduction of the length of the ice rink and installing applying a new "sport court" surface to the rink which would

allow it to be used yearround for craft shows, music and movies along with roller hockey and Dek hockey. There is a Dek hockey rink adjacent to the ice rink at Coal Street Park in Wilkes-Barre.

When developing the master plan, the committee noted the rink is used sparingly due to lack of ice, and "sport court" surface would allow for year-round use. The remainder of the rink space would be used for a splash pad. Because of its cost, a splash pad would be addressed in the final phase of the plan, unless substantial funds become available before then.

Township secretarytreasurer Pamela Heard said the township must provide a 50 percent match for the grant. She said she expects some of that match will be provided by the Kahlau-Madry non-profit foundation formed after the death of former Crestwood High School athlete Tanner Kahlau who was killed in a skiing accident in New York. The remainder of the match will come from the township.

Heard noted township officials are excited to

high priority in the master plan. "We have been really lucky with DCNR support of our projects,' she added.

Meanwhile, township supervisors at their November meeting did away with the township's recreation committee.

Asked about why the action was taken, township officials explained that over recent years the committee lacked a quorum for its meetings and was unable to take any action. Secretary/treasurer Pam Heard noted many people are willing to help out with different events but do not have the time to commit to serving on the committee. She pointed to the successful Fall Festival held at the township park which was organized by volunteers.

Supervisors also voted to advertise for a park consultant. Heard explained that because the master plan was funded and approved by DCNR, it requires the township to have a consultant.

### Wright Township aiming to avoid tax increase

Wright Twp. officials are hoping to avoid a tax

increase by using a small portion of the township's .5 mill fire tax to fund needed repairs to the municipal building.

At a budget meeting last week, board chairman Don Zampetti told Wright Twp. Volunteer Fire Department leaders that the township needs about \$50,000 to make necessary repairs to the municipal building, including a new roof. Zampetti said rather than raise its property tax, the township would like the fire company to agree to shift a small portion of the fire tax to the township's general fund for 2025 only.

"We don't want to raise taxes," Zampetti explained. "The school district already raised taxes this year and we don't want to add an additional tax increase onto our residents," he added. Township secretary/ treasurer Pam Heard said about .07 mills would generate the \$50,000 sought by the township.

Asked about the fire company's surplus, fire company president Gary Price told supervisors the surplus from the fire tax has been going into the department's capital reserve fund to be used for a down payment on a



\$1.26 million fire engine expected to be deliver in July of 2026. That vehicle was ordered in 2022. He said the department currently has about \$423,000 in that fund.

Price asked supervisors if the township would consider applying for a \$800,000 statewide Local Share Account (LSA) grant in conjunction with Rice Twp. to fund the remaining balance of the new fire engine. He said Rice Twp. officials have already expressed their willingness to apply for the grant with Wright Twp. Wright supervisors indicated they would support such a grant applica-

Price said he would be willing to bring the township's request to the fire department membership for its approval on the condition the reduction in the fire tax be for just one year and the township's willingness to apply jointly with Rice Twp. for the LSA grant.

Zampetti emphasized the township would not be lowering property taxes, but rather shifting a small portion of the fire tax revenue to the general fund.

### Local budgets and tax rates for 2025

It's that time of year when municipalities across Mountain Top present their 2025 budgets along with tax rates.

Wright Twp.'s proposed budget for 2025 totals \$2,735,848. The current general fund property tax is .8 mills and the fire tax is .5 mills, bringing the total to 1.3 mills. That tax rate is not expected to change.

Rice Twp.'s proposed 2025 budget was approved at the supervisors November meeting. The financial plan calls for receipts of \$4,162,958 and expenditures of \$4,086,588, leaving a \$76,370 surplus. While the total budget is over 4 million dollars, actual operating expenses are far less. The budget includes about \$2.4 million in state grants which are earmarked for township projects.

To fund that fiscal plan, supervisors voted 2-1 to increase the property tax from its current .26 mills to .78 mills for 2025. Supervisors Rick Arnold and Bob Pipech voted in favor of the increase while supervisor Tom Romanysyhn voted no. That increase in the property tax will generate about \$180,000 in additional revenue next year. Additionally, supervisors voted unanimously to institute

a .3 mill fire tax next year.

Fairview Twp.'s proposed 2025 budget calls for general fund expenses of \$1,996,453. The township's fire tax will increase from .3 to .4 mills, bringing the township's total property tax levy to 1.55 mills.

Dorrance Twp. supervisors approved the

township's proposed budget which calls for general fund expenditures of \$562,300 and maintains the property tax at .75 mills.

Nuangola Borough's proposed 2025 budget is \$411,133 and council president Joseph Tucker said the property tax rate will remain at .444 mills. The annual cost for borough residents for trash and recycling removal will remain at \$475. Last year the borough signed a three-year pact was GFL for trash and recycling services at a cost of \$571.225.

# **MMI Students Celebrate Founders Day**

Students at MMI Preparatory School honored their School's founders, Eckley Brinton Coxe, and his wife, Sophia Georgianna Coxe, during a program at graveside service and at the School on Tuesday, giving thanks for the Coxes' contributions to the School and the area.

Senior class officers laid a wreath on the Coxes' grave at St. James Church on Tuesday morning and Donna Titus, Associate Dean and English Department Chair and longest tenured faculty member at MMI, provided a few words at the site. The class then toured the historic

Coxe home and enjoyed refreshments. Upon return to the School, they worked with the underclassmen to provide the history of the School's founders with a play and other activities.

Head of School Theresa Long reflected, "Our history is both deep and extraordinary. Honoring Eckley and Sophia Coxe gives students a meaningful chance to express gratitude for the vision and determination of the Coxe family, which shaped the School as we know it today." The School also celebrated with an all-school holiday lunch on Tuesday, the last day of classes before the

Thanksgiving break.

The lives of Eckley and Sophia Coxe provide an interesting history of the early coal-mining days and history of the Hazleton area. After graduating from Penn in 1858, Eckley was sent abroad to continue his studies at the Ecole des Mines in Paris, France. He attended the Mining Academy in Freiberg in Saxony, where he studied mechanics, which piqued his interest in mechanical inventions that aided the mining industry. After returning to the US in 1864, he established Coxe Brothers & Co. to combine control of the coal lands. Soon, his firm

controlled more than 35,000 acres of coalfields and increased coal production. This consolidation brought almost every mining operation in NEPA under his control and is considered to be one of Eckley's greatest accomplishments.

He then produced the Mining and Mechanical Institute – today's MMI Preparatory School. This institution, founded in 1879, was chartered in 1894 as an all-boys' school to teach the sons of miners. Today, it is a co-educational college preparatory school serving students in grades six through 12.

His wife, Sophia Georgianna (Fisher) Coxe, was equally well known throughout the region. Because of all the charitable works she performed throughout her lifetime, she was known as the "Angel of the Anthracite."

Her love of people and concern for their welfare prompted her to establish a hospital in Drifton, the first one in the area. Sophia also helped found St. James Episcopal Church in 1884 and taught Sunday school at the church for 40 years.

On November 26. 1925, Sophia celebrated her 85th birthday and Thanksgiving as she made her last public appearance. Even though she was in ill health and her physicians advised against attending, she was determined to dedicate her newest accomplishment, the MMI gymnasium. Sophia Coxe died four months later on March 3, 1926. She is buried beside her husband in the churchyard of St. James Episcopal Church.
